#### **Maths**

#### Core Scheme: Abacus

3 place decimal value, converting between fractions and decimals, BODMAS, algebra, mental multiplication, time intervals, the grid method of multiplication, using brackets, area, perimeter and volume, using the 4 rules with fractions, dividing by 2 digits, calculating and drawing angles.

#### Core Scheme: Abacus

Reading and writing 7 digit numbers, decimal numbers to 3 dp, equivalent fractions and decimals, multiplying fractions and decimals, 2D shapes and angles, mental addition, factors and multiples, prime numbers, long division, adding and subtracting decimals, reading and constructing graphs, ratio, number sequences and word problems.

#### Core Scheme: Abacus

Decimal place value, positive and negative numbers, algebra, fractions and percentages, scaling by multiplying and dividing, multiplying decimals, dividing with decimal remainders, coordinates, adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions, ratio, intervals of time, unusual multiplication methods, binary numbers, the Fibonacci sequence and word problem solving.

CLPE / POR - Private Peaceful, Stay Where You Are and Leave - fiction: link to WW1 history topic, role playing of characters, debating the story for different perspectives, reviewing writing style of author, weekly comprehension work on each chapter.

Other literacy: Writing challenge assessment, weekly spelling test, GL assessments, cliff hangers, exploring poetry, different types of WW1 poetry, exploring imagery for poetry written from the WW! front, Christmas - based poetry, weekly handwriting practice.

Grammar: revisiting commas, advanced adjectives for developing stories, adverbial phrases for actions and emotions in stories, indirect and revisiting direct speech, showing degrees of intent- relative clauses, using different tenses, trickier plurals, suffixes, prefixes, noun phrases, exploring different ways to open sentences, advanced conjunctions revisiting, sentence parsing, including brackets, colons, semi colons.

CLPE / POR - Rose Blanche, When the Sky Falls and Varmints - fiction and non-fiction: link to history and PSHE topics, role playing, exploring how characters tell their own story of WW2 differently, exploring characters living in different ways in society, weekly comprehension work on each chapter.

Other literacy: Writing challenge assessment, weekly spelling test, adapting language in different time frames, reports for different audiences and purposes, revisiting and further exploring writing auto biographies / biographies / diaries, further poetry styles and stanzas for WW2 poetry, weekly handwriting practice.

Grammar: paragraph development, revisiting quantities, to avoid "lots" and "loads", proper nouns, collective nouns, different meanings of prepositional phrases, possessive pronouns revision, doubling more complex consonants, other spelling patterns, suffixes, mixing verb tenses for sentence openers, concluding sentences, to end stories meaningfully, including italics, ellipses.

CLPE / POR - The Viewer / Pax - fiction: links with history, geography and PSHE topics, role playing of characters in different or historical settings, how characters relate to others on society, standing out from the crowd role playing, drawing on experiences of characters in life, weekly comprehension work on each chapter.

Other literacy: Writing challenge assessment, weekly spelling test, GL assessments persuasive writing skills, writing a debate - comparing ideas, different points of view, letters of application writing, continuing and expanding on creative writing with "show, don't tell", using the senses and emotions of characters, weekly handwriting practice.

Grammar: spelling patterns, trickier prefixes and suffixes, trickier plurals revision, antonyms, synonyms, homophones' revision, exploring more dynamic adjectives and synonyms, to reveal intentions of characters, direct and indirect speech revision, relative pronouns within complex sentences, adverbial sentence openers, using dashes, hyphens.

#### PSHE/Oracy:

Current affairs and weekly news topics for class project and discussion. Children to work in two's or threes to present to the class.

#### Jigsaw Scheme:

British values, Celebrating differences, why differences should be accepted and embraced in any society.

Discussion why differences matter and make life better and more interesting.

Learning about and discussing religion and the diversity of beliefs around the world and in the past.

#### PSHE/Oracy: Debating:

World issues, economic issues, health issues affecting home and the planet, building and developing friendships, looking after each other, keeping safe in strange or new places.

#### Jigsaw scheme:

Dreams and Goals, Healthy Me. For diversity and inclusion, lots of discussions on mental health and growth, what it would take to be happy in a society that sees you differently.

#### PSHE/Oracy:

P4C weekly topics for discussion, debating, learning to adapt and compromise, preparing for new schools, sex education talks- how the body works and develops, end of year revision of topics, further sex education.

#### Jigsaw scheme:

Relationships, Changing me in the world. For diversity and inclusivity, learning about gender issues on a different and deeper level, discussing how the body changes, how hormones change people's behaviour, puberty, growing into an adult, sexual relations. Discussion about acceptance of how different people are in society. Open discussion about civil partnerships and same sex marriages.
